- Based on Tierney & Sutton Identification of Attributes of Successful Organization in Disasters
 - Resilience Will be Driven by Individuals, Organizations, Peer Organizations, Infrastructure, Supply Chain, Interface with Local Government, & Structures

- Individual Resilience
 - Internal Organization Resilience
 - Peer Organization Resilience
 - Resilience of Cross Sector Collaboration
 - Resilience of Integration with Local Government Through Pre-event, Response, Recovery
-

- **Immediate Occupancy**
 - Hospitals, police, fire
 - Emergency Operations
 - **Life Safety**
 - Minimum expectation for new buildings
 - Typical retrofit objective
 - **Collapse Prevention**
 - Minimum retrofit objective
 - Not for new buildings

Objective	Time Frame to Occupancy
Collapse Prevention	Never
Life Safety	Eventually
Immediate Occupancy (Essential Services)	Hours

Elements of A Resilience Standard



- Defined Strategic Disaster Mission
 - Hazard Assessment
 - Facility Resilience
 - Disaster Operations Plans
 - Response, Ops, Coop, Recovery
 - Intra- and Inter-sector Support Agreements
 - Donations & Volunteer Management
 - Training, Exercises & Continuous Improvement
 - Disaster Education & Communication
 - Financial & Reimbursement System

- Community Resilience Needs to be Holistic and Inclusive
 - Resilience Definition Needs to Recognize That no two CBOs/FBOs are the Same
 - Resilience Standard Needs to Include CBOs/FBOs in Emergency Management Hierarchy
 - Resilience Needs to be Sustained Technical and Financial Support
 - There is No Redundancy in the CBO/FBO sector -- “No Safety Net for the Safety Net”
